

I. Switzerland and the Lausanne region

By its central geographical location, Switzerland is an ideal international destination for business, incentive and leisure travel. It is a country with many different facets. It unites an impressive variety of landscapes in a small geographical area and benefits from an exceptional natural heritage. As an important centre for communication and transport between the countries of Northern and Southern Europe, it has a common frontier with Germany, France, Italy, and the Principality of Liechtenstein. The Alpine Arc,



just a few kilometers away from Lausanne, features some of the finest mountain peaks like the Matterhorn, Mont Blanc or the Jungfrau, and spectacular passes: Grimsel, St Gotthard, Simplon and Great St Bernard. These natural assets are further enhanced by security and dependability, Swiss values par excellence.







The second largest city on the shore of Lake Geneva, Lausanne combines the dynamics of a business town with its ideal location as a holiday resort. Sport and culture are a golden rule in this Olympic capital. Nature, historic town, contemporary architecture, and exceptional surroundings: the Olympic capital is a model of the art of living and of cultural events. No need to wear out your shoes to visit the town and its region. A dense public transport network gives you the freedom to go from the lakeside to the trendy



neighborhoods within minutes. Considered as one of the greenest towns in Europe, Lausanne gives preference to soft mobility: bikes are available for free, so hikers can explore the Lavaux vineyard trails. As one of the leading gastronomic regions throughout the world, Lausanne is the home of plenty of star-studded chefs, tables d'hôte and typical inns. Culinary... and cultural diversity: over twenty museums, theatres, concerts and the Lausanne Béjart Ballet. The town is the stage of permanent activities, for example the event "Lausanne Estivale" offering 400 free-of-charge shows every year.



II. Access to Lausanne



...from Geneva International Airport

If you are arriving by airplane in Geneva, multiple types of transport are available on site to get to Lausanne. As the airport is divided into the French and Swiss side, it is important to exit through the Swiss side if you are transferring from a French airport.

By train

The train station is located inside the T1 terminal, with trains leaving 5 times every hour. Tickets can be purchased from the machines located in the station (CHF, Euro or credit cards), from the station counters and also from the CFF online shop (www.sbb.ch/en/). If you wish to acquire an unlimited public transport pass for either 4, 8, 15 or 22 consecutive days or one entire month, you can purchase a Swiss Pass at www.railaway.com.

By car

If you wish to access Lausanne by car, you can either get a taxi in front of the terminal or hire a rental car at the company desks on the arrival floor. The fastest route is the A1 motorway heading north. Access the center of Lausanne by using the "Lausanne Sud" exit.





V. Useful Information

Currency

Please note that Switzerland remains with the Swiss franc, usually indicated as CHF. While Switzerland is not part of the European Union and thus is not obliged to convert to the Euro, many prices are nonetheless indicated in Euros so that visitors may compare prices. Merchants may accept Euros but are not obliged to do so. Change given back to the client will most likely be in Swiss francs.

Information centers

The two information and reception centres of the tourist office are located in the railway station and in the Ouchy district down by the lake. They are linked to the historic centre by the m2 metro line. Make sure you drop in there to take advantage of the thousands of services on offer – ticket office, travel passes, area map, recommended itineraries, documentations, hotel and restaurant information, help and security services, etc. – and find out about current cultural and leisure events, some of which you can attend free of charge.

Swiss Pass

The Swiss Pass affords you unlimited travel on Swiss Travel System's public transport network on either 4, 8, 15 or 22 consecutive days or one entire month. Choose your personal travel route from approximately 20'000 kilometers of train, (postal) bus or boat routes. Your personal choice includes the classic scenic routes, the public transport systems of 41 Swiss cities, and gives you 50% discount on most mountain-top trains and cable cars. To top it off, you will profit from free entries to approx. 400 museums and other interesting discounts accorded to you by our Bonus Partners.

Swiss Flexi Pass

The Swiss Flexi Pass allows travelers to freely choose their traveling days. With the Swiss Flexi Pass, you get on those days validated for free travel the free Admission to museums and the other discounts. On the days between the first and the last validated day, your Swiss Flexi Pass offers a 50% discount on train, (postal) bus and boat rides, as well as on most mountain-top excursions.

VII. Your venue: the Lausanne Olympic Museum

The Olympic Experience



The 15th CSCWD Conference will be held in the world renowned Olympic Museum. This inspiring venue is one of the most beloved locations in the region and attracts people from around the globe. The universal values upheld by the ancient sporting institution are embodied and conveyed by this singular place.

The museum's setting is as unique and remarkable as the Olympic story itself. Perched on the lakeside hill facing the Alps, the building is surrounded by stunning gardens and art pieces. On the inside, the modern architecture shelters various expositions pertaining to the history of the Olympic Games and the legends that

helped make it into the event it is today. It is the home to many invaluable objects like the many different torches used during the various editions or pieces of equipment worn by gold winning athletes.

Visiting the museum reveals itself to be an interesting and stimulating experience. The exhibits are lively and interactive, making it easy to immerse yourself in the exploits of the past. The museum also has a library, a video library, an Olympic study center, an auditorium and a panoramic restaurant.



The Conference

Besides from its expositions, the Olympic Museum also acts as a privileged conference center. The entire CSCWD Conference will take place in this beautiful building. The main conferences will take place in the multi-purpose auditorium (seating capacity of 170) whereas the workshops will be held in three meeting rooms with a maximum capacity of 60 each. Coffee breaks and lunch will be served on location.

A registration and information desk will be present on location for participants to pick up their badge and gift bags.

Access

The Olympic Museum is easily accessible. From the Place du Port in Ouchy, the park entrance is about 300 meters away. Once you have arrived at the Olympic Fountain, go through the park by foot or by escalator.

Zermatt



Located 177 Km from Lausanne, Zermatt gives you the opportunity to see the most photographed mountain in the world: the Matterhorn. The small village of Zermatt, surrounded by the beautiful Alps, is considered to be one of Switzerland loveliest sites. The climate is usually favorable with 300 sunny days a year which makes for great photos and an unforgettable day.

Option 1: Gornergrat and tour of Zermatt

With its panoramic terrace perched at 3089 meters, the Gornergrat is one of the most appreciated sites in Switzerland. The view is truly breathtaking with a panorama on the Mont Rosa, the Gorner glacier and 29 other peaks over 4000 meters. Getting there from the Zermatt station with the highest railway in Europe is by itself an incredible experience!

Public transport

Take the train heading to Brig at Lausanne Train Station. Stop at Visp to transfer to train heading to Zermatt. Duration of trip: 2h45 min (roundtrip)



• All inclusive Train Fare (without Swiss Pass)

You can purchase an all-inclusive train ticket at Lausanne Train Station which covers the Lausanne to Zermatt trip as well as the train ride up to Gornergrat. Prices are CHF 177.60.- for adults and CHF 88.80.- for children.

Option 2: Matterhorn Glacier Paradise and Schwarzsee Paradise

Discover mystical, icy worlds in the highest glacier palace in the world. You arrive at the glacier palace with one of the 2 lifts directly from the Matterhorn glacier paradise station. You then walk into the palace through an ice tunnel that is almost fifteen meters below the surface of the glacier. Discreet lighting and ethereal sounds accompany you through a minor wonder of the world of glaciers. Information about the creation of the glacier palace, glaciology and impressive statues sculpted from ice round off an experience of a very special kind.



Schwarzsee Paradise is a marvelous lake at the foot of the Matterhorn

can be reached in only 12 minutes from the Matterhorn Express Valley Station. To access from the Matterhorn Glacier Paradise: 1. Take the lift to Gandegg Hütte station 2. Change lifts and take the one going to Furgg 3. Take the final lift going to Schwarzsee Paradise.



Once in Interlaken Ost, take the train to Brienz (platform 1). In Brienz, take the postal bus 107 heading to Ballenberg. Duration of trip: 3h08 (one way)

In Aigle, take the TPC train heading to Les Diablerets (platform 13/14)

Jungfraujoch-Top of Europe



The unforgettable trip to our high-Alpine wonderland of eternal ice and snow is the true "highlight" of a visit to Switzerland. At an amazing 3454 metres, this is Europe's highest-altitude railway station :100% guarantee of snow & ice! The Sphinx observation hall and terrace, the glistening Ice Palace, a walk on the eternal snows of the Jungfrau plateau. Amazing year-round attractions on the Jungfraujoch-Top of Europe

A remarkable route:

Interlaken Ost - Lauterbrunnen - Kleine Scheidegg - Jungfraujoch - Grindelwald - Interlaken Ost.

This unique round-trip by modern cogwheel railway takes you first to Kleine Scheidegg, altitude 2061 metres, at the foot of the notorious Eiger North Wall. From here the Jungfrau Railway climbs to the station at Eigergletscher, well known for its mountain restaurant.

The trip continues through the Eiger tunnel to the stations at Eigerwand and Eismeer, with a five minute halt at each. Enjoy spectacular sightseeing through large observation windows hewn from solid Alpine rock.

And then the arrival on the Jungfraujoch, in the heart of a glorious glacier world on the very roof of Europe! Superb views extend as far as the summits of the Vosges Mountains in France and the Black Forest in Germany. The Great Aletsch Glacier, at 22 km the longest ice-stream in the Alps, begins on the Jungfraujoch-Top of Europe.

Don't forget to wear good shoes, sun glasses and take some warm clothes with you as the temperature at 3'600m. is rather low even in summer!

Tour of the Gruyères castle and cheese factory



At the foot of the Pre-Alps, you will be enchanted by the charm and picturesque architecture of the medieval town of Gruyères. The town has given its name to the area and to its delicious cheese. Come and explore a little town that's been unaffected by the passage of time, built in a superb setting.

A visit to the castle is a journey across eight centuries of architecture, history and culture. "Gruyères" is a thrilling multimedia show (images, music, light and sound) available in 8 languages; it brings the visitor out of time, on a discovery of the wonderful story of the castle. Every day, every 30 minutes.

Situated in the very centre, near the alpine pastures and at the foot of the Château de Gruyères, La Maison du Gruyère invites you to discover the king of cheeses: Le Gruyère AOC. There, you'll learn all the secrets about the ancient art of making the famous cheese.

Tour of the Chillon Castle and Montreux



Between the shores of Lake Geneva and the Alps, the Chillon castle is an architectural jewel located in the most beautiful setting imaginable. With over 1,000 years of history, the monument has always inspired artists and writers, from Jean-Jacques Rousseau to Victor Hugo and Lord Byron, from Delacroix to Courbet.

Vaudoise" due to its micro-climate. Freddie Mercury and Charlie Chaplin are amongst the many celebrities that have fallen in love with the region's exquisite and peaceful setting. On the shores of Lake Geneva, the seven kilometres of flower- and palm tree -adorned banks in Montreux offer a sumptuous view of the Alps.

City Excursions

Bern



Bern is Switzerland's capital city and has remarkably well preserved its historical aspects through the centuries. The old town was able to be entered onto UNESCO' listing of World Heritage Sites in 1983. Bern has a huge range of things worth seeing —cathedrals, Zytgologge (time clock centre), BearPark, the house and square of Parliament, the River Aare, over 100 fountains, the Lauben, the zoo- all these and much more make Bern a real Mecca for tourists.

Option 1: BearPark

The new bear park was inaugurated in 2009 and is one of the most popular attractions in the whole city. This tour is quite special for children and adults alike. Paths for visitors follow the Aar River and allow them to get a good close view of the animals. The natural setting allows the bears to live the life they've always wanted in a beautiful setting. This attraction is free of charge.



Option 2: House of Parliament

The House of Parliament is the headquarters of the swiss Government (Federal Council) and the Parliament (National Council and Council of States). The building was completed in 1902 and the central domed hall and both chambers feature numerous symbolic renderings of Swiss history. Organised tours which last 45 minutes can be booked one day in advance. Visits are free of charge but official ID papers must be left at the front desk.



Option 3: Rosengarten

The rose garden is a large park with a wonderful view of the old town and the Aare river. It is home to 220 different types of roses, 200 types or irises and moor beds with 28 types of rhododendrons. A must see for flower lovers.



Option 4: Shopping

Bern has one of the biggest covered markets in Europe which is easily accessible by from the train station. When leaving the station, turn left and follow Bärenplatz.

The Chapel Bridge:

Considered the oldest wooden covered bridge in Europe, the Chapel Bridge was constructed in the 14th century as part as the city's fortification. It was named after St. Peter's Church which is nearby. The paintings that were added in the 17th century illustrate scenes of Swiss and local history, including the biographies of the city's patron saints, St. Leodegar and St. Maurice.



KKL Luzerne (Culture and Convention Center Lucerne):

The KKL Luzern (Culture and Convention Centre Lucerne) at Europaplatz is the work of the Parisian architect Jean Nouvel. The Concert Hall (1'800 seats) is one of the finest concert halls in the world. The Lucerne Hall, the Convention Centre with the Auditorium, and the Museum of Art – the fourth largest in the world – are also part of this sensational construction.



Swiss Museum of Transport:

The Swiss Museum of Transport is the most diverse museum for transportation and communication in Europe. More than 3,000 items are exhibited in a space as large as 40,000 square meters.



Rigi:

Mount Rigi, at 1800 m above sea level, is the «queen of the mountains» for many people, having been the famous mountain in Central Switzerland for over 100 years, where Europe's first cogwheel train was built. Enjoy a fantastic view of the Alps, which includes 13 lakes and extends as far as Germany and France. The excursion to Rigi Kulm is a combination of a cogwheel train ride, an aerial cable-car ride and a boat trip on Lake Lucerne.
